Graduation Information

Believe it or not, it's already May, meaning that graduation is just around the corner. Our plan is to hold graduation outside in the Beaver Stadium. Spectators will not need a ticket to attend and seniors can invite as many guests as they would like. If the weather doesn't permit that, we will move the ceremony indoors to our gym. In that case, each senior will be provided with six (6) tickets for guests. We will live-stream the ceremony. A link to the live stream will also be made available on the high school website for anyone who is interested in watching the ceremony but is unable to attend.

State Testing, AP Testing, ASVAB Testing

The ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) test has been administered to interested students several times through the year. On May 21, the ASVAB will be administered to all juniors. Achieving a score of 31 or better is one way for students to complete one of the Washington State graduation requirements. AP testing will be happening on campus the first and second week of May. Teachers have been working with participating students, so no additional steps are necessary for families to complete.

State-required SBAC (Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium) testing will begin on May 20. All sophomores and some seniors are required to participate. Obtaining passing scores on the SBAC exams is one way that students can complete one Washington State graduation requirement.

Graduation Requirements

After all this talk about graduation requirements, you might be wondering what the Washington graduation requirements are. In terms of credit earning, here's how the graduation requirements breakdown. Every student must earn a total of 24 credits in the following categories:

Graduation Requirements cont.

4 credit hours in English/Language arts, 3 credit hours in Math, 3 credit hours in Science, 3 credit hours in Social Studies, and 1 credit hour within the Career Technical Education (CTE) category, and 2 credit hours in Health and Fitness. That totals 16 credit hours.

In addition, students must either earn 2 credit hours in Fine and Performing Arts OR 1 credit hour in Fine and Performing Arts and 1 credit hour in a "personalized pathway" course. What's a personal pathway course? It's a locally-determined course that leads to a specific post-secondary career outcome chosen by the student and based on that student's interest. One example would be a metals course for a student who is interested in welding as a career or an advanced math course for a student who is interested in engineering. These two additional credit hours brings the running total to 18 credit hours.

Students also need to earn 2 credit hours in World Languages like Spanish or ASL OR 2 additional credit hours in that student's personalized pathway. A student could, therefore, successfully graduate by completing 2 credit hours in Art and 2 credit hours in World Languages OR 1 credit hour in Art and 2 credit hours in World Languages. There are a number of options. This brings our running total to 20 credit hours.

Finally, students must earn 4 credit hours in electives. An elective is really any credit-bearing course. A metals class could be an elective. An art class could be an elective. A math class could be an elective. A course can't be an elective credit AND fit into another category, but, as an example, a government class could be counted as an elective if that student has already filled out the 3 credit hours required in the social studies category.

What about the state testing requirement? How does that fit in? All students are required to take the state test, and passing those Math and Language Arts tests are the quickest and best way to satisfy one of the Graduation Pathway requirements. The ASVAB exam is another way. It is a bit complicated, so if you have more specific questions give our student services department a call at 360-841-2800 and ask for our counseling office.

Attendance in school is crucial for a student's academic success and overall development. Regular attendance ensures that students receive consistent instruction, participate in classroom discussions, and engage with their peers, all of which contribute to a comprehensive learning experience. Additionally, attendance fosters a sense of responsibility, skills that are vital for success in both academic and professional settings.

It is essential for parents and guardians to be aware of the state guidelines regarding school attendance to support their child's educational journey. According to these guidelines:

- · After one unexcused absence, the school is required to notify the family in writing.
- The state allows fifteen absences in a school year; after that, a doctor's note is necessary for any additional absences.
- After three unexcused absences, families will be notified by the District's Student Engagement Coordinator.
- Between two and seven unexcused absences, appropriate steps must be taken including the use of WARNS or other assessments, date-informed interventions, or convening the IEP or 504 team if applicable.
- Seven unexcused absences in a month may lead to an agreement with the student and parent, establishing attendance requirements.
- After seven unexcused absences in a month and not later than fifteen in a school year a Truancy Petition can be filed with the Juvenile Court.

Parents and guardians are encouraged to communicate with the school office through various channels, such as phone calls, Skyward absences requests, or emails, to stay informed and address any attendance-related concerns promptly.

CHARACTER STRONG LESSONS HAPPEN ONCE A WEEK IN GRIT

(Gratitude - Resilience - Integrity - Team)

In May, Freshmen will continue to look at the impact of honesty in building trusting relationships. Then, students will reflect on the year of Character Strong and utilize reflection as a way to form goals for the future. Additionally, students will reflect on the ways they have grown as a way to cement the learning they have done throughout the year.

Sophomores will be reviewing and reflecting on their learning in GRIT this year. This will mean making sure we understand mental and emotional wellness, creating positive new habits, and working towards goals as to who we'd like to be.

Junior students will reflect on their learning this year by writing a letter to their future self, to be read at the time of their graduation, as well as sharing something that they learned this year that was particularly meaningful to them.

Senior students are wrapping up their discussions on selflessness and will shift their focus to normalizing kindness and practicing specific gratitude. Students will end the month reflecting on their character-strong work over the year and how it's impacted their lives.


The ceremony will be live streamed in the commons for extra attendees, no tickets required.


